CITY OF MOSCOW, IDAHO TREE PLANTING PROGRAM PARTICIPATING SUBDIVISIONS

Homeowners in participating subdivisions have the opportunity to receive free trees for planting in the tree lawns located in the rights-of-way fronting their properties. To take advantage of this program, homeowners need to follow the steps below.

1. **Submit Application to Plant Tree(s):** The homeowner submits an application to the Parks and Recreation Department for a permit to plant trees in the right-of-way and requests utilization of funds from the Tree Planting Dedication Fund. A City of Moscow Street Tree Selection Guide is available to help homeowners choose their tree(s).
2. **Application Reviewed:** The Parks and Recreation Department reviews the homeowner's application for appropriateness of species and planting location and determines whether the homeowner qualifies for funds from the Tree Planting Dedication Fund.
3. **Approval of Permit/Voucher Issued:** Once the permit is approved, it is mailed to the homeowner along with a voucher for the specified tree(s). The voucher is issued for an amount allocated for the tree(s) in the original tree planting dedication assessment.
4. **Use Voucher to Purchase Trees:** The homeowner purchases the tree(s) at the nursery (**using the voucher like cash**) and plants tree(s) in the approved location(s).
5. **Nursery Invoices City:** The nursery bills the City directly for the cost of the tree(s) not to exceed the amount indicated on the tree voucher. The tree voucher and the nursery invoice are mailed to the City.
6. **Approval of Invoices:** City pays invoice after initial inspection and approval of plantings.
7. **Follow-up Inspection:** One year following planting, a follow-up inspection of the plantings is done to determine their condition.

The term of the tree planting program for each subdivision will be ten (10) years from the date of City Council approval of the final plat for that subdivision. Tree allotment will be based on the City's Arboricultural Specifications and Standards Guide.
